

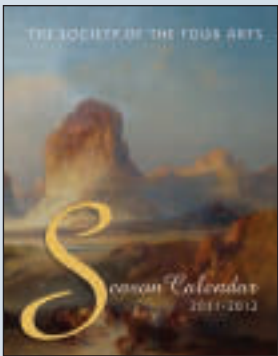

Capital Campaign ‘Quiet Phase’ Tops \$10 Million Goal; Four Arts to Focus on Members, Community for Remaining Efforts

After announcing plans to renovate the Fitz Eugene Dixon Education building last spring, the Four Arts began quietly meeting with donors and board members to begin raising funds for the project. In three months' time, The Four Arts had raised more than \$10 million in gifts and pledges. The campaign is shaping up already as the most successful “quiet phase fundraising project” in the organization’s history.

As next season gets underway, The Four Arts will seek an additional \$9.8 million in gifts and pledges as construction begins. The building’s largest feature, the 250 seat playhouse, remains available at \$5 million.

“The playhouse will be a very exciting donation, both to the Four Arts and to the donor,” explained Development Director Katie Edwards. “As one of the main destinations for the building, the auditorium will be named for the donor, and that family will be forever associated with the programs and history of The Society of the Four Arts.”

The education building will be the future home to the Four Arts’ Campus on the Lake, a continuing education program for adults, offering workshops, art classes, lectures and field trips.



This gracious plaza will be the focal point for students and patrons entering from The Village Lane. Featuring a handsome central fountain and paved with beautiful artisan pavers, the plaza will also offer a curved inlet for visitor drop-off and pick-up.

In addition to the auditorium, the building will feature a fully-equipped demonstration kitchen for cooking classes; workshop space for painting and floral arranging classes; a media center with computers and photography equipment; and several classrooms and offices.

An unusual feature planned for the education complex is the artist-in-residency program, where a visiting artist will actually live at The Society of the Four Arts in an apartment on the second floor of the Dixon Education building. Each visiting artist will teach classes while working on a new work of art while residing at The Four Arts.

A groundbreaking ceremony for Capital Campaign supporters, board members and town officials will take place during the 2011-12 season. Construction is expected to be completed in one year to 18 months.



President's Letter

Dear Friend of the Four Arts:

As we send this special Summer Edition of FOLIO, we're celebrating an important milestone.

Earlier this summer, at the end of last season's fiscal year, we learned that we've reached our ambitious 60 percent participation goal for annual fund-raising at The Four Arts.

For nonprofit organizations like ours, there are two measures of fund-raising success. The first yardstick is familiar: the absolute dollar amount raised each year. By that measure, we did well in 2010-11, raising more than enough to stay "in the black," as we have done annually for more than a decade. The second measure is the *participation rate*: the percentage of our members who make any donation, large or small, above their annual dues.


Reaching a donor percentage of 60 percent is almost unheard of. Many nonprofits are happy if even ten percent of their members and patrons make an annual gift. Our high participation rate suggests that our members and patrons value The Four Arts, appreciate our efforts to enrich their lives, and feel good about supporting this vital community institution.

As we thank and salute you for helping us reach this milestone, we're happy to report yet another success. Last spring, our trustees and Development Committee launched the "quiet phase" of a major capital campaign whose ultimate goal, over the next two years, will be to raise \$20 million to acquire and renovate the old Palm Beach Public School. When fitted out for a new life as headquarters for our burgeoning Campus on the Lake education program, it will be known as the Fitz Eugene Dixon Education Building.

Our goal was to raise at least \$10 million in gifts and pledges during the quiet phase – half of the campaign's total goal. Within six weeks of starting our campaign, we had passed that milestone, paving the way for a successful public campaign when we're all back in Palm Beach next fall.

Where does such success come from? From generous, supportive, enthusiastic people like you. You are not only the reason we exist; you are also the reason we prosper, flourish and grow. Thank you!

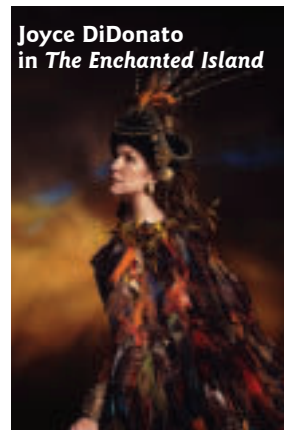
In addition to gently-used offerings, selections of new books from Classic Bookshop will be available for purchase with a generous percentage of sales going to the Restoration Fund.

An Annual Report From the Four Arts: A Summary of the 2010-2011 Season

The Society of the Four Arts ended our 75th Anniversary season with a 10% increase in donations over the previous season, for a final total of \$2,333,502 raised. The participation rate among members (those who donate above the amount of their dues) reached an all-time high of 61%.

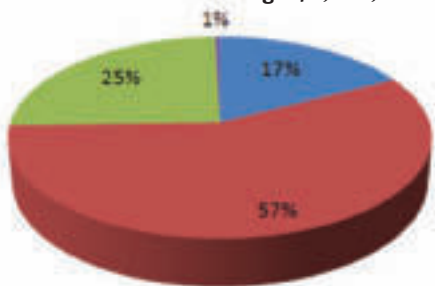
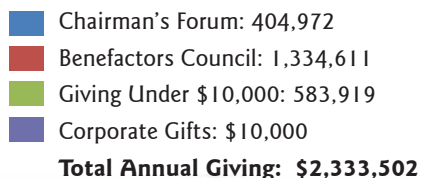

The 2010-2011 season included more than 307 programs that drew 125,654 visitors. Of these, 135 were offered at no charge.

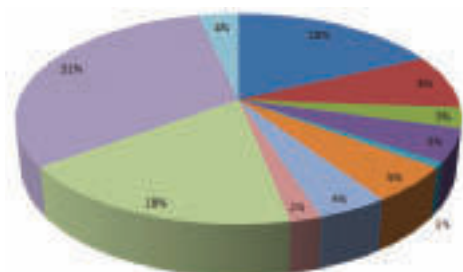
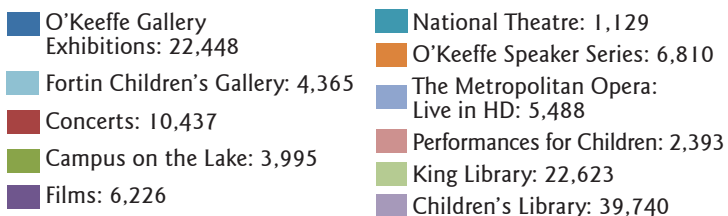
By the Numbers: A Breakdown of Four Arts Fundraising and Attendance

The Four Arts Holds 75th Anniversary Celebration for Members and Guests

The Society of the Four Arts celebrated 75 years of art and culture with a garden party on Sunday, April 3 in The Philip Hulitar Sculpture Garden. More than six hundred members and supporters enjoyed tea sandwiches, sweets and champagne as violinists strolled through the garden providing entertainment. As the evening ended, guests received beautiful note cards featuring scenes from the Four Arts gardens painted by artist and Four Arts Trustee, Connie Geisler.

In attendance were Four Arts Chairman Patrick Henry and his wife Heather; Tom and Melinda Hassen; Peggy and Dudley Moore; Jesse and Rand Araskog; Robert Nederlander and Pat Cook; and many other of the organization’s long-standing supporters.

The Society of the Four Arts has a long history in Palm Beach. On May 19, 1934, an announcement signed by Mrs. Lorenzo E. Woodhouse, Mrs. Maude Howe Elliot and Mrs. Frederick Johnson stated that a group of citizens of Palm Beach had decided to organize for the purpose of promoting an interest in art, literature, music, and science and ultimately, the creation of a library and art museum. They chose the name Civic Arts Association. On January 14, 1936 the name of the Civic Arts Association was changed to The Society of the Four Arts and the organization was formed into a nonprofit corporation. On February 8, 1936 the Society received its charter.



The Four Arts continues the mission of promoting an interest in the visual arts, music, drama and literature, and has expanded its outreach to serve hundreds of thousands each season. For more information on events for the upcoming season, visit www.fourarts.org.

The Fitz Eugene Dixon Education



The Playhouse/Auditorium. Colorful, dramatic and fitted with state-of-the-art sound and lighting, the playhouse will constitute the largest and most important feature of the new Dixon Building. With the proscenium stage and seating for 250 to 300, the playhouse will be the perfect venue for smaller concerts, intimate performances and lectures attracting more than 100 participants. A level floor will allow this flexible space to be turned into a ballroom or cabaret.



The Central Lobby. This downstairs space just west of the Dixon Building's main foyer and gallery constitutes the building's main "crossroads." With two elevators and the building's stairway opening into it, the Central Lobby will be a place where visitors seek information, wait for friends to arrive, and pause before or after a class begins.

The Playhouse Lobby. This beautiful open entrance provides a welcome to the theater/playhouse. Each side of the lobby will be a soaring two-story space with dramatic chandeliers and windows on two sides providing natural light.



The North Terrace. This outdoor space on the Dixon Building's north side — secluded by hedges, shaded by trees and enhanced by outdoor sculpture — will serve as an outdoor classroom and as a social gathering place. Attractively paved and convenient to the building's kitchen, the North Terrace will enhance both the educational and recreational possibilities of the building.
