## Paintings from The Royal Holloway Collection on display at the Four Arts starting March 13

The final exhibition of the Four Arts' 2009-2010 season will be Paintings from the Reign of Victoria: The Royal Holloway Collection, London. Until the North American tour began in October of 2008, the majority of the sixty canvases included in the exhibit had never before been exhibited outside England.

The exhibit will open at The Society of the Four Arts' Esther B. O'Keeffe gallery on March 13, 2010 and will run until April 18. Admission is \$5 for adults. Members and children 14 and under are admitted for free.

Thomas Holloway (1800-1883), a self-made English multi-millionaire, purchased a group of then "modern" paintings during the last years of his life. This collection became the crowning gift to Holloway's generous endowment of a college for women, now known as Royal Holloway, University of London.

The exhibition showcases sixty extraordinary paintings which not only exemplify the astute taste of a late Victorian collector, but also illustrate some of the highest achievements

in the figurative and landscape art of the nineteenth century. The Royal Holloway Collection includes many of the most visible and praised "modern canvases" in London in the 1880s. From scenes of contemporary life, as well as historical events, to landscapes, animal studies, and marine subjects, the exhibition demonstrates Holloway's Victorian

ideal of art as the ultimate civilizing influence. Included are seminal works by such revered artists as Sir Edwin Landseer, William Powell Frith, Sir John Everett Millais, David Roberts, and Edwin Long.

## President's Letter

Dear Friend of the Four Arts:

Not long ago we received a message from someone who enjoys our Sunday afternoon chamber music concerts. She was curious about an item in our concert programs concerning attire at our concerts. "While our Sunday concerts are more informal and casual," the note to patrons reads, "at evening concerts a jacket and tie are required for gentlemen."

"Can you explain the reasoning behind this edict?" our audience member wrote. "...I find it baffling that in 2010 a dress code would have to be enforced. It [suggests] a conservative and arbitrary mentality which does not mesh with the free and spirited tone of the musical pieces that are offered to the audiences. Any understandable explanation will be appreciated."

We explained to our friendly critic that not too many years ago, evening concerts at The Four Arts meant black tie for gentlemen and long dresses for ladies. We explained, moreover, that most of our patrons seem to prefer, even in this ever-more-casual age, a world in which we occasionally dress up, rather than down. Much of life in Palm Beach harks back to a time when elegance in dress and manners, and a certain courtly civility, were the norm rather than the exception.

Conservative? Arbitrary? Perhaps. I would suggest a slightly different way of explaining our slightly old-fashioned ways, however. For most of our history, our national culture was what might be described as an *aspirational culture*. People wore their "Sunday best" to church and other important occasions. Each generation hoped its children would surpass their generation in education, prosperity and gentility. A sense of "appropriate" dress was as important, in that aspirational culture, as a knowledge of appropriate table manners.

Today, when even the slightest formality seems an exception, such aspiration may seem stuffy and quaint. The Four Arts, however— like Palm Beach itself— will probably continue to be a bastion of tradition. We hope our friendly critic won't mind too much. And who knows? Perhaps, over time, we can convince her that it's possible to be "free and spirited" while also being well-dressed.

In this lavishly illustrated lecture, Mr. Andreu will present the amazing Cartier creations collected by the rich and famous throughout the past century, allowing a peek into the glamorous lives behind the glittering baubles.

From the jeweler's extensive roster of important 20th-century collectors, Mr. Andreu will highlight the most fascinating and stylish women of the century – Evalyn Walsh McLean, Anna Gould, Elsie de Wolfe, Daisy Fellowes, Mona Bismarck, Ganna Walska, Gloria Swanson, Merle Oberon, Barbara Hutton, Doris Duke, Babe Paley, Princess Grace of Monaco, Mária Félix, Elizabeth Taylor and, of course, Palm Beach's own Marjorie Merriweather Post, and



the Duchess of Windsor, a fervent admirer of Cartier, whose panther brooches of the late 1940s made the House's trademark feline known around the world.

Decorative arts historian, author, and lecturer, Mr. Andreu specializes in the arts and the luxury industry and serves as an advisor to Cartier North America. As a frequent speaker, he has previously lectured at the Society of the Four Arts as well as other cultural concerns, including Sotheby's Institute of Art in New York, French Heritage Society in Los Angeles, Hillwood Museum and the United States Department of State in Washington, DC.

## Legendary performer Mitzi Gaynor Brings Razzle Dazzle to The Four Arts March 31

Television and film actress Mitzi Gaynor will perform her one woman show, *Razzle Dazzle: My Life Behind the Sequins* at the Four Arts Gubelmann Auditorium on March 31 at 8 p.m.

Ms. Gaynor has appeared in such legendary Hollywood films as *My Blue Heaven*, *Golden Girl*, *Bloodhounds of Broadway*, *We're Not Married*, *The I Don't Care Girl*, *There's No Business Like Show Business*, *The Birds and the Bees*, *Anything Goes*, and *The Joker Is Wild* alongside



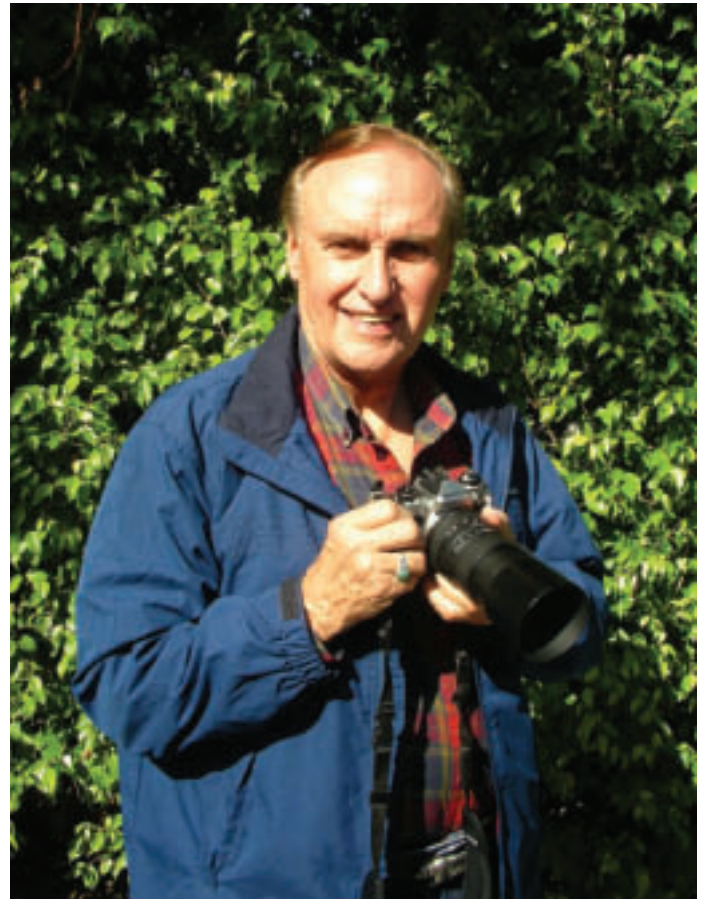
Frank Sinatra. She was cast alongside Gene Kelly in the lavish, globe-trotting MGM musical *Les Girls* and earned the coveted role of Ensign Nellie Forbush in *South Pacific*, and the soundtrack, featuring Mitzi's performances of "I'm Gonna Wash That Man Right Outta My Hair" and "A Wonderful Guy" has never gone out of print and remains to this day a perennial seller.

In 1961, Mitzi made her nightclub debut in Las Vegas causing *LIFE* magazine to note "Mitzi fractures Las Vegas...she began at the top and climbed even higher." Branching out into the television medium, Ms. Gaynor was lauded for performance on the Ed Sullivan show, and various award shows, and went on to become well known for her dazzling network holiday specials. Each special was a lavish blend of song, dance and sparkling comedy with guests drawn from the top ranks of show-business including Bob Hope, Michael Landon, Carl Reiner, George Hamilton and Suzanne Pleshette.

Throughout the 80's and 90's Mitzi continued to entertain sold-out audiences at top concert venues and performing arts centers across the United States and Canada. She returned to the theatrical stage starring in a multi-city tour of the revival of *Anything Goes*. She also added a new dimension to her career as a witty chronicler of Hollywood history in a popular series of columns for the influential trade paper *The Hollywood Reporter*.

Despite a career marked by extraordinary achievement, Mitzi remains in search of new horizons to conquer. She can be seen in the new public television documentary *Mitzi Gaynor: Razzle Dazzle, The Special Years*. She resides in Beverly Hills.

## Naturalist and Filmmaker Tom Sterling to Address Issue of Invasive Species April 9

Citing examples from all over the state, Tom Sterling explains how students and concerned citizens can develop an awareness to perhaps slow or stop the often dangerous introductions of non-native animals and plant life threatening the balance of Florida's ecosystems.

In this illustrated presentation, Tom Sterling will explain the massive impact that "alien wildlife" has on our native wildlife as well as the impact on our economic future. A wildlife tour of The Sunshine State will reveal many plants, mammals, dozens of bird species and at last count, over 150 species of alien fish, amphibians, and reptiles.

For more than 30 years, naturalist and filmmaker Tom Sterling has collected film footage on many exotic species of animals that he has encountered in his travels. He is a regular contributor to the popular PBS wildlife series *Profiles of Nature* and *The Nature of Things*, as well as the producer of several specials for Canadian Broadcasting.

## “Talk of Kings Book Discussion Group” Growing in Popularity

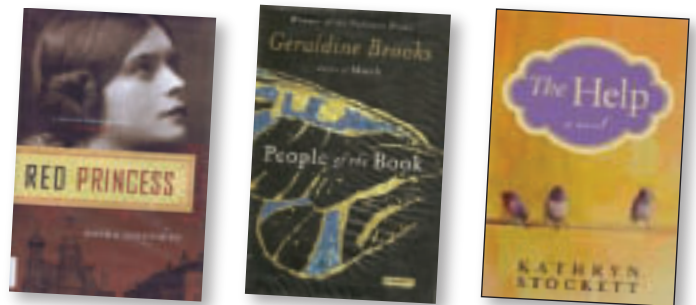

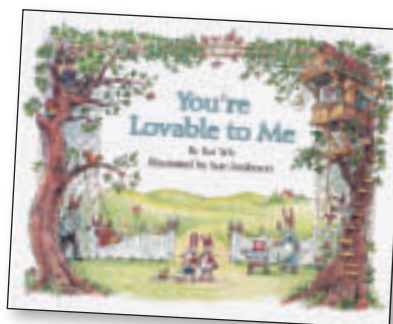
## Children’s Library Plans Two Garden Events for Pre-Schoolers
