

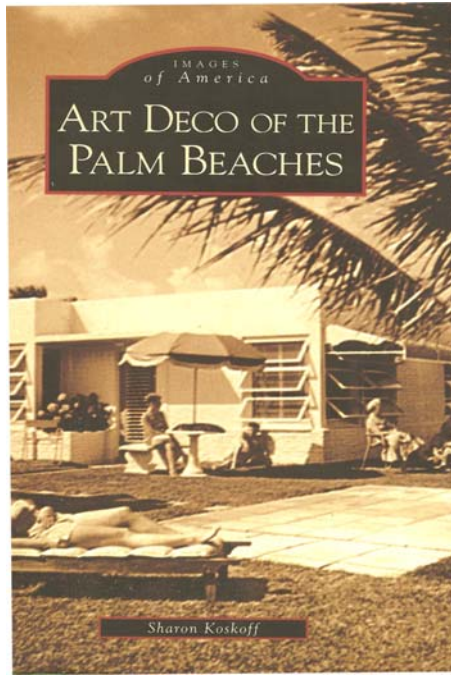
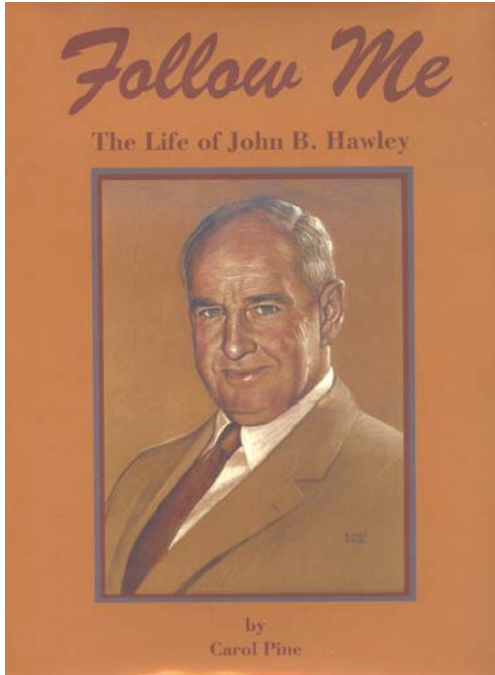

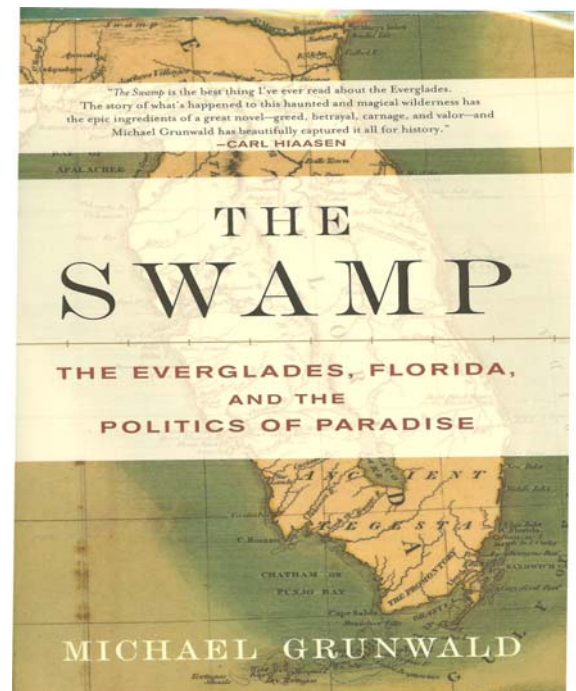
THE ATTACK YASMINA KHADRA
