Dr. Warner is known to us for his learned and witty insights into his subject matter, and of the lives who created it.

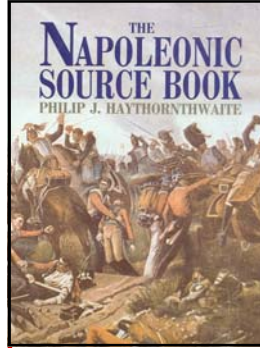

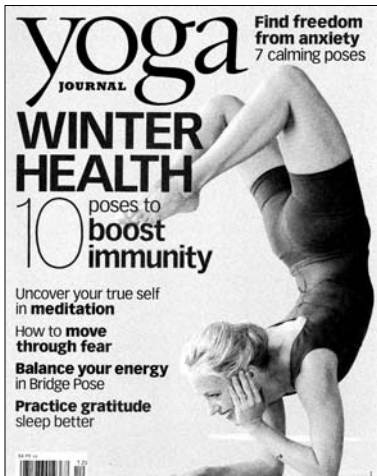

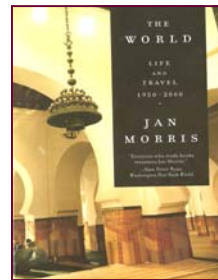
And if you want to try the pose at home, most of our back issues are available for check-out.

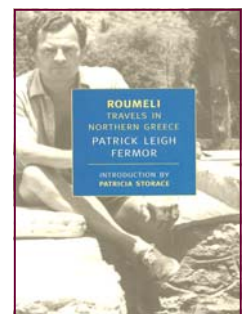
